UPGRADE OF THE BOAT RAMP and surrounding area

We have reported in recent Newsletters about the delays in this project. We can now report that the re-consideration of the design undertaken at the behest of SABFAC (the SA Boating Facilities Advisory Committee which advises the State Government) has been completed and, importantly, the support of the three main stakeholders – SABFAC, the DCYP and the BPPA – has been reconfirmed.

Regrettably, there have been some further delays among other government agencies but, frustrating as these are, the project remains back on track.

We remain hopeful that all the approvals can be in place before Christmas, which would open the way for construction to commence in the New Year.

As we have reported previously, the new ramp will be much longer, and a little higher as it crosses the beach, than the existing ramp. It will include quite a substantial turning area down close to the water, and will provide for the much safer and more efficient launching and retrieval of boats.

Importantly, the key features that our Association has regarded as critical continue to be incorporated in the updated design.

The updated plans and specifications were drawn up, and put out to further public tender; and the construction firm has been selected. The remaining step is to finalise the planning approvals mentioned above, with the final step in that process being the Minister's approval. At the time of writing, your Association is doing all we can to ensure that these approvals are expedited. All parties are aware that if these approvals are not in place before Christmas, there is the obvious danger that our project will get caught up in the pre-State election hiatus.

Current thinking continues to be that the most likely ramp closure period will be from mid January to mid April, with a view to the new ramp being open for Easter and the school holidays. We acknowledge that whatever dates are chosen will inconvenience people, but we would ask everyone to be understanding, and think of any inconvenience as a small price to pay for a new, much safer, and more efficient boat ramp. The view of our Committee is that for us to seek any further delay would run the real danger of putting the whole project at risk.

We have re-iterated this early warning to our members and to the local community, so we can all start thinking about finding alternative sites for launching and retrieving our boats during the Black Point construction period. The most obvious alternative is Ardrossan, with Pine Point also being available for smaller boats when the tide conditions are right. Port Vincent and Port Julia might be other options; while some may choose to leave their boats on moorings for longer periods.

In conjunction with the Council, we will send out a further notice as soon as we have a firm time-line for construction of the new ramp.

MAXINE HAWKE PARK

All but one of the Acacia Cyclop & boxthorn piles from the working bee in June within the MHP was burnt before the commencement of the Fire Ban season thanks to Patrick Hill & Kym Woolford.

Unfortunately, grant money for re-vegetation projects has dried up in recent times in the present climate but we will continue to explore opportunities.

Your Committee has undertaken additional Fire Safety mowing within the MHP over and above what Council is committed to and encourage all land owners to also keep grasses under control during what could be a very high fire danger season.

If anybody has time over the festive season, we would encourage you to spend some time removing tree guards from the last tree planting. These trees and shrubs should now be able to withstand the onslaught of rabbits which are re-establishing themselves unfortunately.

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT RE-ISSUE

Those members who are situated on Crown or Leasehold Land, would have recently received a "Notice of Land Tax Assessment" from RevenueSA. You may have noticed a large hike in the amount to pay compared to last year.



Members of your Committee have had dialogue with representatives of RevenueSA who have now confirmed an error has been made in the Land Tax Assessments for Crown/Lease Land properties at Black Point. If you have received such a notice, please disregard and wait for the Notice to be re-issued, or contact RevenueSA, if you have any concerns.

The following is the advice received from RevenueSA.

"Dear Mr Xxxxx,

In response to your email of 26 November 2013 I would like to advise that a recent change in the Certificate of Title reference for your leased property at Black Point resulted in the property being incorrectly transferred into your Ownership for the 2013-2014 financial year.

We are currently rectifying this issue and a new Notice of Assessment will be issued to you in due course.

CROWN LAND LEASES AND ANNUAL LICENCE

Following a direct approach by the Committee to the Chief Executive, Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources and a meeting with the Coast Protection Board, we have been advised that all necessary Government Department approvals have been received and documentation is now being prepared for the Minister's approval. Once the Minister has signed off, Lands Title Office will prepare and distribute the Deed and draft Leases for execution by Shack Owners. Hopefully we will receive these documents early in the New Year.

New Annual Licence documents are expected to follow at a later date. For consistency, all relevant terms and conditions of your Licence will be updated to reflect the relevant terms of the Lease(s).

COAST PROTECTION – MAINTENANCE OF SEA WALLS

At a meeting with the Coast Protection Board on 6 November 2013 it was agreed that Shack Owners should be reminded of the procedures recommended for undertaking any development on their Crown Land Shack Site including coast protection works. A copy of the article explaining the recommended procedures and distributed to all Black Point Association members in a "Special Edition Newsletter " in September 2012 is now on our website for your information. The Committee of the BPPA strongly recommends that Members consult with the Coast Protection Board and the District Council of Yorke Peninsula before submitting a Development Application for any proposed work that falls outside of the description "Like for Like Maintenance".





REX MINING HILLSIDE PROJECT

A highly debated and unprecedented Project, which risks significant change to the Central Yorke Peninsula environment, industry and the whole profile of our region, it is important that all members take time to be familiar with the project- even if you might consider that "it won't affect me"- it will! A project of this size will have an impact- directly or indirectly on our community in both the immediate and long term. There are a range of different views about this project, from many individual perspectives, and as such

I encourage all members to take time to read ALL the information available on the YP Landowners Group website, <http://yplandowners.com.au/> the Yorke Peninsula Council, <http://www.yorke.sa.gov.au> Rex Minerals <http://www.rexminerals.com.au/> and our BPPA site <http://www.blackpoint.org.au/> - to consider the information and range of issues, that are being challenged, comments and new info, as Rex Mining seeks to have the Mining Licence granted.

While the public consultation period has ended, the next step is a progressive one of feedback and ongoing assessments (which can take some months) - where Rex is required to respond back to DMITRE to all of the key issues and questions raised in submissions from other departments, individuals and groups.

Some of the submissions (of which there were 251 received, representing approx. 236 different groups or individuals) are available for public access. The key issues from the submissions included, insufficient consultation, risk to environmental protection (noise, dust emissions-risk of toxicity), impact on existing industry (especially agriculture and tourism) and infrastructure. As previously reported, The Community Consultative Group CCG (on which I am a member, as a BPPA and local service provider representative) identified some 64 key issues, which require attention by DMITRE and Rex.

The CCG members will remain in communication throughout January and will meet again in February to keep up to date with developments and the pressure on ensuring that all issues are being thoroughly addressed. Whatever your view as to benefits or risks- please consider **that** decisions of today- have significant impact, not only for the proposed mine life, but for decades beyond. With any development or change, the principle of *sustainability* should be paramount.

While comprehensive assessment must be given to the immediate risks and benefits to the environment, employment, services for the existing community, industry, people, economy, however it is also critical that inter-generational equity underpins any decisions about the Hillside project. The need to ensure that health, biological and ecological integrity, and productivity of the environment is maintained or enhanced for the benefit of future generations must be demonstrated. These are the essential factors that have underpinned our thinking about any development or change within our Black point community- and, as such, should also be considered when we consider any project or new initiative. Feedback, comments and questions about both the benefits as well as issues you may have about the proposed project are welcomed and encouraged.

CERES WIND FARM

Development approval is the hands of the Development Assessment Commission, DAC & the Minister. Unfortunately, a 42 turbine wind farm has been recently approved, with 26 operating and development conditions, at Keyenton in the Barossa Valley. A further development for 130 turbines is also proposed adjoining this project.

ARDROSSAN AMBULANCE SERVICE NEEDS YOU







NO STONES ON RUBBISH BINS

Communication has been received that rubbish bins may not be emptied if stones are placed on the lids. It has been an ever increasing occurrence, not only at BP but elsewhere as well, by placing a stone on the lid to help hold it down from the wind which often blows the lid open and then the rubbish everywhere.

The placing of the stones on the lid can cause an obvious safety hazard to the Waste disposal truck driver and also to road users if the stones manage to fall on the road.

Rubbish bins also need to have been supplied by Council ie have the District Council of YP

Use commonsense by;

- Not over filling bins,

- Bagging all rubbish in tied bags (in non-recyclable red lid bins only) or by
- Placing bins on the other side of the road (for those on the beach side of the road) facing away from the prevailing southerly winds or vice-versa during northerly winds.

Please help to keep BP litter free.

Please number your rubbish bins!

Rubbish bins need to be numbered with your shack number to necessitate the correct bins are returned to you. If your bins are not returned, you will need to renew your BPPA membership. What a great service – thank you to Malcolm & Sue Wheare, and our Treasurer, Sandra.

RecFish SA

RecFishSA held it's AGM on the 27th of November where Black Point's Brenton Schahinger was re-elected Chairman of the peak body representing recreational fishing in SA.

Also, noteworthy was the granting of Life Memberships to fresh water fish guru, Peter Teakle of Renmark & Ron Sherriff of Yorke Peninsula. Well deserved by both men.

South Australian Marine Parks: Commercial Fisheries Voluntary Catch/Effort Reduction Program

PLEASE NOTE OFFERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM ARE NOW CLOSED.

The Marine Park network is now established in South Australian waters and marine park management plans and restrictions are legislatively in place.

Within marine parks, 6% of waters will benefit from the extra protection provided by sanctuary zones, where fishing, trawling and mining will be prohibited. The government has now commenced the process to reduce commercial fisheries catch and effort in preparation for fishing restrictions in marine park sanctuary zones that commence on 1 October 2014.

Given the importance of considering future fisheries management, PIRSA is administering the Commercial Fisheries Voluntary Catch/Effort Reduction Program on behalf of the State Government.

The program will assist the commercial fishing industry to

adapt to sanctuary zone fishing restrictions by mitigating any potential biological or economic effects from the redistribution of commercial fishing effort to areas outside these zones.

Through the program, commercial fishers in the Western and Central Zone Abalone, Rock-lobster, Marine Scale-fish and Charter fisheries have been invited to make offers to voluntarily surrender their license and/or entitlements. Payments will be made by the State Government to license holders if their offer is accepted.

Information was forwarded to individual license holders in the affected fisheries in July 2013, with offers closing on 30 August 2013. An expert panel including independent experts will now assist PIRSA in evaluating offers.

Applicants will be notified by mid November 2013 if their offer has been accepted or not.

The State Government is confident marine parks can help maintain the health of the marine environment over the long term, which ultimately will help underpin South Australia's valuable commercial fishing industries.


SA Recreational Fishing Guide App
